WRABBY HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

NAME	The Society shall be called Wrawby Horticultural Society.
OBJECTS	To promote and encourage the cultivation and exhibition of horticultural produce. To promote shows as thought desirable. To promote social intercourse between members.
MANAGEMENT	The affairs of the Society shall be under the direction of a President, Chairman, Vice Chairman, Treasurer, Secretary, and a General Committee.
MEMBERSHIP	Membership to the Society shall be free and open to any other person in the parish of Wrawby.
ANNUAL MEET-ING	A general meeting of the members will be held in each year for the purpose of presenting a report of the year's proceedings and a statement of accounts.
ALTERATION TO RULES	No alteration shall be made in the Rules except at the Annual General Meeting seven days notice of proposed alterations must be given to the secretary in writing.

RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. All articles for competition must be in the hall for 11.am and remain until after prize giving, when all must be cleared away. No articles or prize cards to be removed earlier. This rule to be strictly adhered to.
2. All pots, boxes and trays etc. must be provided by the exhibitors and must be clean and free from private mark. A number will be provided for each exhibit. Paper plates will be provided. Glass jars to be used for jam, curd etc.
3. All exhibits for competition must have been grown/made by the exhibitor with the exception of Classes 48 and 49. Those violating this rule will forfeit all entrance fees and prize money.
4. Every precaution will be taken to protect the property of exhibitors, but the Committee do not hold themselves responsible for loss or damage.
5. No one but the Judges, Secretary or stewards shall remain in the place of exhibition while judging takes place.
6. The Judge's decision shall be final. Judges shall have power to withhold any prize if the specimens are not considered worthy.
7. Any complaints or disputes that may arise must be referred to a Committee member before 4 pm accompanied by a deposit of £1, which will be forfeited if the objection proves frivolous.
8. Exhibitors may take more than 1 prize in any 1 class.
9. The Committee reserve the right to refuse or accept any entry.
10. Tops of carrots, beetroot, parsnips and turnips not to exceed 6 inches.
11. Prizes not claimed within 14 days will become the property of the Society.
12. Any questions arising and not covered by the foregoing rules will be decided by the Committee.
13. Cups are to be returned to the Society, in good condition, one month before the show.
14. Section 8 is for schoolchildren under 16 yrs only.
15. A person is named a novice until they have won 4 first prizes in section 1.
16. Section 6 Exhibit should not have been entered in Wrawby show before and should be made within last 12 months
